# Iowa Legislature 2023 End of Session

## **Bi-Partisan Bills Passed into Law**

- Property tax relief for seniors, vets, middle-class lowans, and those on a fixed income (HF 718)
- Prohibit unfair real estate contracts that target older lowans (HF 475)
- Suicide hotline number on student ID cards (HF 602)
- Expand access to healthcare in rural areas by designating facilities as Rural Emergency Hospitals (SF 75)
- Allow consumers to opt-out of having their personal data sold to other companies (SF 262)
- Helping volunteer firefighters and emergency service providers purchase tires at better price (HF 603)
- Prohibit non-compete agreements for mental health professionals to stop pause in services for patients (HF 93)
- Expands mental health services via a multi-state counselor compact (HF 671)
- Protect students with misconduct transparency & expanded mandatory reporters (HF 430)
- Ensure patients get discounts on prescriptions, not out-of-state companies (HF 423)
- Change funding to draw down an extra \$103.9 million to expand health care through Medicaid (HF 471)
- Expanding Maternal Health Options (HF 265)
- Increased penalties for human trafficking crimes and sexual exploitation of a minor (SF 84, HF 630)
- Expanding access to dental care (HF 656)
- Cutting red-tape in juvenile courts (HF 216, HF 113, HF 359)
- Property tax credit deadlines for elderly, disabled, and low-income lowans extended (HF 318)
- Makes a property tax fix providing over \$100 million in property tax relief to Iowa homeowners (SF 181)
- Deadline to protest a property tax assessment is extended to and include May 25th for disaster declared counties (HF 270)

- Allow partisan local elections (SF 23)

- Ivermectin and hydroxychloroquine allowed to treat COVID-19 without any professional discipline (SF 160)
